1 2 3 4 5 UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT WESTERN DISTRICT OF WASHINGTON 6 In Re 7 PRISON ELECTRONIC FILING 8 PILOT PROJECT 9 GENERAL ORDER NO. 02-15 10 11 The United States District Court for the Western District of Washington ("the Court"), 12 the Washington Department of Corrections ("WDOC"), and the Washington Office of the 13 Attorney General ("WOAG") have agreed to participate in a one-year electronic filing pilot 14 project ("E-Filing Pilot Project"), commencing June 1, 2015. The E-Filing Pilot Project is 15 expected to increase efficiencies in pro se prisoner filings and save costs to prisoner litigants, the 16 WDOC, and the Court by reducing expenses for paper, envelopes, copying, postage, and staff 17 time. This General Order sets forth the rules for managing the E-Filing Pilot Project. 18 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: 19 1. The E-Filing Pilot Project includes all prisoner civil rights and habeas corpus 20 cases brought under 42 U.S.C. §1983, 28 U.S.C. §§ 2241, 2254, or 2255. 21 2. Participation in the E-Filing Pilot Project is mandatory for all prisoner litigants 22 incarcerated at the Washington State Penitentiary ("WSP") and Stafford Creek Corrections 23 Center ("SCCC").

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- 3. All filings submitted by prisoner litigants to the Court (correspondence, pleadings, motions, and briefs) (hereinafter "court filings") must be electronically submitted to the Western District of Washington. If a prisoner litigant is later transferred to another facility not included in the E-Filing Pilot Project, he or she shall resume submitting all court filings by mail.
- 4. Correspondence and requests for discovery between a prisoner litigant and any defendant or respondent shall **not** be electronically submitted but will continue to be exchanged by mail.
- 5. Original service of a complaint or petition shall **not** be electronically submitted. Prisoner litigants who have paid the Court's filing fee must effect service according to the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. Original service of a complaint or petition on behalf of prisoner litigants proceeding in forma pauperis will be as directed by the Court.
 - 6. Electronic court filings will be processed as follows:
 - a. Prisoner Litigant Submission of Court Filing: The prisoner litigant will provide WDOC staff with the original court filing. The court filing must comply with the requirements set forth in the "Electronic Filing Requirements for U.S. District Court," a copy of which shall be posted or distributed with this Order consistent with WDOC practices. WDOC staff will scan the court filing on a digital scanner and will email the resulting Portable Document Format (PDF) document file to the Court at an email address designated by the Court. After the original court filing has been scanned and sent to the Court, WDOC staff will return the original to the prisoner. The prisoner litigant is expected to keep the original court filing and produce it at a later time, if ordered to do so by the Court.

- b. **Docketing**: After the Court receives the court filing by e-mail, it will perform a quality review and will docket the court filing electronically.
- c. Notice of Electronic Filing ("NEF"): When a court filing is docketed, a Notice of Electronic Filing ("NEF") is issued. The NEF confirms the date of docketing and contains an electronic link to the court filing. The NEF will be transmitted to an email address established by the Court and WDOC at WSP or SCCC. WDOC staff will print and provide copies of the NEF and the court filing to the prisoner litigant through the institution's existing mail system.
- d. Defendant/Respondent Submission of Court Filing: After a defendant or respondent has electronically submitted a court filing, WDOC staff will print the NEF and the court filing and provide a copy of both to the prisoner litigant through the institution's existing mail system.
- e. Other Registered User Defendants: In cases involving defendants who are not state officials (i.e., local, city, or county officials) who are registered users of the Court's electronic filing system, the Court will order those defendants to accept service of a prisoner litigant's court filings electronically and will notify those defendants that service by mail of their court filings to the prisoner litigant is no longer required.
- f. Court Orders: When the Court issues an order (or other communication) directed to the parties, the WDOC staff will print and provide the prisoner litigant with copies of the NEF and the Court-issued order (or other communication) via the institution's existing mail system. Receipt by the prisoner litigant of the NEF with the Court order (or other communication) constitutes service on the prisoner litigant.

1	The Clerk of Court is authorized to develop, implement, publish, and modify as
2	necessary additional administrative procedures to manage the E-Filing Pilot Project.
3	This General Order shall become effective June 1, 2015 and shall remain in effect
4	through May 31, 2016, subject to extension upon agreement of the Court and WDOC. The Court
5	or WDOC may terminate the E-Filing Pilot Project at any time. Before June 1, 2016, the Court
6	and WDOC will evaluate the E-Filing Pilot Project and determine whether it should be
7	continued, terminated, modified, or expanded.
8	IT IS SO ORDERED.
