If a continuance of the trial is desired, counsel must first contact the courtroom deputy, Victoria Ericksen, at (206) 370-8517 or by email at <a href="mailto:victoria ericksen@wawd.uscourts.gov">victoria ericksen@wawd.uscourts.gov</a> to obtain a potential new trial date. When seeking a trial continuance by stipulation, counsel must:

- 1. State specific facts establishing good cause for the continuance. A request for a continuance "in order to provide the parties more time to prepare, in the interest of justice" is not a sufficient showing to warrant a trial continuance;
- 2. File a speedy trial waiver signed by the client with the stipulation. The court will not consider the motion unless and until the waiver is filed. Although not dispositive on the subject, these waivers are useful to the Court in establishing that defendants have been consulted and are in agreement with the requested continuance; and
- 3. Have the defendant waive speedy trial to a date at least 30 days beyond the requested new trial date.
