ORDER

Pursuant to the provisions of Title 28 United States Codo, Section 137, it is hereby agreed and ordered by the undersigned active judges of this court that the division of this court's business among said judges shall be made as

- In the Southern Division of the court, sitting at Tacoma, Washington, all civil, criminal and other proceedings where venue lies in that court shall be assigned to
- In the Northern Division of the court, sitting at

Lindberg, if available; 19 20 otherwise they may be heard by any other judge of this court. 21 Proceedings under Section 2255, Title 28 United 22 States Code, shall be assigned to and handled by the judge 23 who imposed the sentence involved. 24 If immediate action is necessary in any case or 25 proceeding assigned to a particular judge and that judge is 26 unavailable for any reason, any other judge may hear and 27 dispose of the matter requiring immediate attention, but 28 such action shall not constitute reassignment of the case 29 or proceeding. 30 When civil or criminal actions involving a common question of law ex fact are assigned to different judges and 1/9/69 32 it appears to the clerk that there may be good reason to -5assign all of said actions to one judge, the clerk shall transfer the actions to the calendar of the judge to whom the first case was assigned.

- 7. As to any other matter or proceeding not provided for under this division of business order, the clerk shall refer the same to Judge Lindberg for assignment or disposition.
- 8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, each of the judges of this court shall have and perform any and all of the authority and duty otherwise by law conferred upon him to hear, try, and dispose of any and all of the cases, matters and business of this court when he consents to do so.
- 9. All conflicting orders concerning the division of the court's business heretofore entered are vacated by this order.
- It is further provided that this order shall be 10. reviewed whenever the business of the court or other circumstances indicate the need for revision, such review to be considered at least once every two years in order that the business of the court may be equitably divided among the judges, and particularly with respect to the roving judgeship.

The effective date of this order shall be January 1, 1969.
