10 GENERAL ORDER

12 No persons, including law enforcement officers, shall bring or bear any firearm or other
13 dangerous weapon into the United States Courthouse without the specific authority of the
14 Judge presiding over a particular matter or by the Chief Judge.

15 The United States Marshal and Deputy United States Marshals, or those acting in an
16 official capacity under the direction and control of the United States Marshal, are exempt from
17 the above Order.

18 U.S. Pretrial Service Officers, U.S. Probation Officers, and sworn law enforcement
19 officers assigned to work within the courthouse are allowed to enter and carry their firearm to
20 their offices, where the weapon will remain under their immediate control or be secured.

21 Case agents, the United States Attorney, or Assistant United States Attorneys
22 transporting weapons that are to be, or have been, admitted as evidence may bring these
23 weapons into the Courthouse as long as such weapons are unloaded and locked in such a
24 manner as to prevent loading and firing.

2 The United States Marshal is directed to bring this Order to the attention of the officers
3 and agencies whose officers may have occasion to come to the Courthouse carrying firearms.
