OFFICIAL COURT REPORTERS. }

WHEREAS, action taken by the Judicial Conference of the United States at its meeting held on September 22 and 23, 1966, with regard to transcript rates of court reporters, approved an increase over existing rates; and,

WHEREAS, the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington finds that existing rates for ordinary transcript and for daily transcript are insufficient to provide a fair and just return for the making of such transcript because of the increase in typing costs, the costs of supplies, and the general high level of prices; it is, therefore,

ORDERED that, from and after the date of this order and the certification thereof to the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts, the transcript rates in this district shall be:

provided that the charge for daily or other expedited transcript shall be fixed by agreement of the parties subject to the approval of the judge presiding, and, in lengthy cases, fixed after the conclusion of the case, with progress payments to the reporter or by deposits ordered by the court.

That the term "daily transcript" is defined as that in which a transcript of each day's proceedings is delivered following adjournment and prior to the normal opening hour of the court on the following morning whether or not it actually be a court day.

That the above rates shall apply to all court orders for in forma pauperis transcript dated on or after the date of this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a certified copy of this order fixing new transcript rates shall forthwith be sent by air mail by the clerk of this court to the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts pursuant to Bulletin No. 491, Supplement 2, dated October 7, 1966, from that office, requesting certification of the effectiveness of the new rates which shall be in effect on and after this date.
