Order Amending the Order re Division of Business entered September 12, 1917.

It is now Ordered that the order in re division of business entered September 12, 1917, be now amended to read as follows:

Pursuant to the provisions of Section twenty-three (23) of the Judicial Code, the undersigned, Judges of this District, have agreed upon the division of business and assignment of causes for trial in said district, as follows:

Unless otherwise directed, commencing with the date hereof, Judge Gushman will dispose of all causes and all naturalization hearings in the Southern Division of the district and Judge Neterer will dispose of all causes and all naturalization hearings triable in the City of Bellingham in the Northern Division. Of the causes triable at Seattle, hereafter filed, Judge Cushman will dispose of one half of the civil jury cases taken alternately, the odd numbered equity cases, one half of the criminal cases taken alternately, one half of the forfeiture and condemnation cases taken alternately; and Judge Neterer will dispose of all naturalization hearings, all bank-ruptcy cases, all admiralty cases, all civil court cases, one half of the criminal cases, taken alternately, and one half of the forfeiture and condemnation cases, taken alternately, and one half of the forfeiture and condemnation cases, taken alternately.

The first and third Mondays of each month are hereby designated as motion days for Judge Cushman at Seattle, and every Monday of each month as motion days for Judge Neterer at Seattle.
