In the Matter of Transcript Rates of Official Court Reporters. } ORDER

WHEREAS, action taken by the Judicial Conference at its meeting held on September 27, 28, and 29, 1948, with regard to transcript rates of court reporters, provides an increase over existing rates; and,

WHEREAS, the District Court in this District finds the existing rates of 45 cents per page for original, and 20 cents per page for copy, of ordinary transcript are insufficient to provide a fair and just return in the making of such transcript because of the increase in typing costs, the cost of supplies, and the general high level of prices:

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that, from and after the date of this Order and the certification thereof to the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts, the transcript-rate increase shall become effective; and the transcript rates in this District shall be 55 cents per page for original, and 25 cents per page for copy, of ordinary transcript, and 90 cents per page for original, and 30 cents per page for copy, of daily transcript, provided that the charge for daily or other expedited transcript shall be fixed by agreement of the parties subject to the approval of the judge presiding, and, in lengthy cases, fixed after the conclusion of the case, with progress payments to the reporter or by deposits ordered by the court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a copy of this Order fixing new transcript rates shall forthwith be sent to the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts, as provided in the Resolution of the Judicial Conference.
