





INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE OF
THE "SCHEDULE"

For certain Federal misdemeanor and petty offense charges listed in the "Schedule," defendants in the Western District of Washington have the option to pay a fixed sum to the Clerk of Court instead of appearing in court. If a defendant makes such a payment timely, that amount is forfeited; defendant need not appear in court; and the case is closed.

The Court has adopted this "Schedule" listing all misdemeanor offenses and petty offenses for which a defendant has that option and also listing all petty offense and misdemeanors that require a mandatory appearance. An officer who issues a citation or violation notice should be certain how the offense charged is treated in the "Schedule":

(a) If the "Schedule" provides a dollar amount of bail for the offense in question, that amount must be entered in the box at the lower right on the citation or Violation Notice.

NOTE: Neither the officer, his superior, nor the United States Magistrate has discretion to vary from the provisions of the "Schedule" in a given case.

(b) If the offense is listed as "Mandatory," the charge is not one which can be resolved by forfeiting a specified amount, and the defendant must appear in court when directed; i.e., when notified to appear by the Central Violations Bureau (CVB) in Los Angeles.

(c) If the offense is not listed in the "Schedule," a citation or Violation Notice should not be issued. If the officer or agency believes prosecution is appropriate for unlisted violations, the matter should be referred to the Complaint Section of the United States Attorney's Office, 3600 Seafirst Fifth Avenue Plaza, 800 Fifth Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, telephone number (206) 442-4126 (FTS 399-4126).

Authority for the adoption of the "Schedule" is based upon Rule 4(a) of the "Rules of Procedure for the Trial of Misdemeanors Before United States Magistrates." In the Western District of Washington, the full-time United States Magistrates are authorized to establish and, from time to time, amend the "Schedule" by Local Rule MR 9(j).

Suggested modifications or additions to the "Schedule" and questions about its use should be presented in writing to the Chief of the Complaints Section, United States Attorney's Office, 3600 Seafirst Fifth Avenue Plaza, 800 Fifth Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, telephone number (206) 442-4126 (FTS 399-4126).

Amendments consisting of new or substitute pages will be distributed by the United States Attorney's Office as they are made by the Court from time to time. Each office or agency is responsible for making its officers or agents aware of all relevant changes and for maintaining a current copy of the "Schedule."

Under federal law, a felony is an offense punishable by death or by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year. No felonies are listed in the "Schedule."

Under federal law, a misdemeanor is any offense punishable by imprisonment not exceeding one year, that is, the maximum sentence of imprisonment is one year.

Under federal law, a petty offense is an offense, for which the maximum period of imprisonment does not exceed six months and the maximum fine does does not exceed \$500.00, or both.

Each section of RCW 46 set out on the following pages 2-9 is classified for Federal purposes as either a petty offense or a misdemeanor.

Unless otherwise noted, where the section is noted as being a "PETTY OFFENSE," the maximum sentence is imprisonment of not more than 90 days and/or a fine of not more than \$250.00. (See RCW 46.64.050, RCW 9.92.030, and 18 U.S.C. § 1--RCW 9A.20.020 would not appear to be applicable to crimes defined in Title 46 as 9A applies only to crimes "defined in Title 9A.")

Unless otherwise noted, where the section is noted as being a "MISDEMEANOR," the maximum sentence is imprisonment of not more than one year and/or a fine of not more than \$1,000.00. (See RCW 46.64.050, RCW 9.92.020, and 18 U.S.C. § 1.)

[NOTE: DO NOT BE CONFUSED BY THE TERMINOLOGY USED IN THE REVISED CODE OF WASHINGTON (RCW). WHAT THE STATE LABELS A "MISDEMEANOR" IS A FEDERAL PETTY OFFENSE. WHAT THE STATE LABELS A "GROSS MISDEMEANOR" IS A FEDERAL MISDEMEANOR.]

For third and subsequent .504 physical control convictions within a five-year period, same as a second conviction.

For a third and subsequent .502 DWI convictions within a five-year period, a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$1,000.00, and imprisonment for not less than 30 days and not more than one year, and neither minimum fine nor minimum imprisonment sentence may be suspended; and the Court is to revoke license.—See RCW 46.52.100.

In addition to any nonsuspendable and nondeferrable jail sentence required for a second or subsequent conviction, the sentence is to be imprisonment not exceeding 180 days, which is to be suspended, but not deferred, for not more than 2 years.

In addition to any fine and costs, there is a minimum 25% (of any fines and costs) penalty assessment, to be paid to highway safety fund. The penalty assessment may not be deferred, suspended, waived, or modified.
