Travel Restriction for Defendants Accepted into Pretrial Diversion Program ORDER

In many cases defendants who are accepted into the pretrial diversion program operated by the United States Attorney have previously signed appearance bonds which restrict their travel. Occasionally a defendant finds it necessary, for personal or business reasons, to travel outside the limits so imposed. This requires permission of the court in advance, and the defendant must provide the court with information as to departure and arrival dates, and addresses where he/she can be located. Because an individual participating in the diversion program maintains regular contact with a probation officer, it is therefore,

ORDERED that any defendant who has been released on bond by the undersigned, and who thereafter is accepted into and is participating in the pretrial diversion program, may thereafter travel outside the limits specified in the appearance bond to the extent authorized in advance by the
