During the court sessions April 9, 10 and 11, 1975, concerning the herring fishery, exhibits were assigned the numbers JX-3 through 5, USA-71 through 75, PL-98 and PL-99, F-72 and STC-1. These numbers

1 follow directly after the numbers contained in the Master Exhibit List  
2 of the main trial, but they fail to recognize the admission of four  
3 exhibits on November 15 and 20, 1974, the hearings concerned with the  
4 chum salmon run and those admitted on January 14, 1975, the hearing on  
5 the Green River steelhead catch. Those exhibits have not been assigned  
6 numbers although one of the November 15 exhibits was tentatively referred  
7 to as "Exhibit 1." The Court directed the parties to determine a proper  
8 sequential designation for those and other posttrial exhibits but that  
9 has not yet been done.

10 To avoid confusion with the exhibit numbers assigned in April, the  
11 earlier exhibits are hereby assigned the following designations:

 15 those given designations which in some instances were the same as those  
 16 for the exhibits previously admitted by the Court. To avoid confusion  
 17 resulting from this and to more closely conform the exhibit numbering to
