ORDER RE EVIDENTIARY
HEARING

As explained in its previous order, Dkt. # 88, the Court must conduct an evidentiary hearing to determine if Defendant is in contempt of the Court's preliminary injunction, Dkt. ## 42, 51. The Court held a conference with the parties today, July 31, 2020, to discuss the nature of that hearing. In the end, the Court set several parameters and scheduled several dates as described in the table below.

14 The Court also instructs the parties to meet and confer about the other topics
15 discussed at the July 31, 2020, Zoom conference. They must submit a joint statement to
16 the Court by **Tuesday, August 4, 2020**, describing the additional parameters of the
17 evidentiary hearing not already covered by this Order.

18 Finally, to be clear, nothing in this Order should be construed as a ruling on the
19 merits. At this juncture, the Court declines to grant or deny Plaintiffs' Motion for Order
20 to Show Cause Why City of Seattle Should Not Be Held in Contempt for Violating the
21 Preliminary Injunction. Dkt. # 51. The preliminary injunction is still in full force and
22 effect.
