PERSONAL FIREARMS FOR COURT SECURITY OFFICERS

**GENERAL ORDER 05-21** 

This General Order addresses an issue recently raised by the Chief Deputy U.S. Marshal for the Western District of Washington. Court Security Officers who work in and around the Courthouses in this District are not currently permitted to carry personal firearms to and from their assigned duty stations. Given the circumstances under which they serve the Court, and the risk to their personal safety before and after they are on duty, the Chief Deputy U.S. Marshal has requested permission for Court Security Officers to carry personal firearms while following strict safety guidelines. The Court has agreed to adopt this policy.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that qualified personnel of Constellis, Inc. (d/b/a Centerra Group LLC., or its successors) may enter upon federal facilities of the Western District of Washington in possession of a personally-owned firearm, to be used solely for self-protection, while coming to or leaving their assigned duty stations. Court Security Officers may not carry personal firearms while on duty.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Chief Deputy U.S. Marshal shall provide a policy for said individuals, clearly setting forth parameters to carry a personal firearm while on federal property. The policy shall provide clear direction to authorized individuals indicating the location of on-premises secured storage for the placement of personal firearms during duty hours, any specific limitations on where firearms may be carried, and a provision that anyone governed by this policy must meet all Washington state permit requirements to carry a concealed firearm.
