Microsoft Windows 10 ships with two browsers: Internet Explorer 11 and the new Edge browser. The Edge browser will be the default browser, and Internet Explorer 11 will be available to support legacy workflows.

The new Edge browser will not have any support for ActiveX plug-ins. Therefore, the Acrobat/Reader plug-in won't work with Edge.

Case Opening "Notice of Removal":

The initial document is the Notice of Removal and its attachments.

The Notice of Removal must contain: A Certificate of Service which lists all counsel with their contact information including their email addresses and any pro se parties who have appeared in state court along with their addresses and phone numbers (if known).

In cases removed from state court, the removing defendant(s) shall file contemporaneously with the notice of removal a copy of the operative complaint, which must be attached as a separate "attachment" in the electronic filing system and labeled as the "complaint" or "amended complaint".

Possible Attachments to Notice of Removal

- Civil Cover Sheet (required)
- Trademark, Patent and/or Copyright forms if filing this type of case (required)
- Copy of the operative complaint described as "Complaint" or "Amended Complaint"
- Copy of any Jury Demand filed by Plaintiff(s) in the State court described as "Jury Demand."

The words "Jury Demand" must be on the caption of the Notice of Removal or; A Jury Demand has been requested in the State Court. If there is no demand as described, and whether or not it is checked on the Civil Cover Sheet, you are required to file a separate Demand for Jury. (*See Local Civil Rule 38*)

The filer is responsible for entering party text exactly as it appears on the original state court complaint. For example, "an insurer" should have been added as party text for Travelers Home and Marine Insurance Company. Amendments to the Local Civil Rules

The local rules, as amended shall apply to every civil case pending in the Western District of Washington, without regard to when the case was filed. The amendments do not alter any court-imposed deadline that sets a date certain.

For actions pending on January 1, 2016, if fewer than 14 days remain to perform an act otherwise governed by these rules, the provisions of the local rules that were in effect on January 1, 2016 shall apply to that act.

Redaction of Filings

Local Civil Rule 5.2 outlines what personal data identifiers need to be redacted in filings with the court. It is best to redact your document prior to converting to PDF format.

Adobe Acrobat has some graphic tools under Comment which can black-out, cover over or remove sections of text. The edits these tools make can be removed with little effort to reveal the text underneath—even if the PDF is flattened, or printed to PDF, after the edits are made. If the PDF was converted (searchable/OCR) you can use the Edit Document Text tool in Acrobat (under Tools - Content) to replace text with the proper [Redacted] language.

Adobe Acrobat Pro does have redaction tools that you can use. For more information on using these tools check out Rick Borstein's post on the Adobe Acrobat for Legal Professionals blog:

General Order No. 03-16 - In Re: Exhibits Retention Pilot Project

Western District of Washington and the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals have agreed to participate in a two-year exhibits retention pilot project ("Exhibits Retention Project"), commencing February 1, 2016 and remain effective through January 31, 2018. This project includes all criminal cases filed in this court

Participation is mandatory for all criminal litigants except for Central Violations Bureau (CVB) proceedings/trials, and for those who receive permission to be exempt by the trial judge.

The project applies to documentary exhibits only, including photographs when possible, and does not apply to physical or oversized demonstrative exhibits.

The new event titled: "Plaintiff/Defendant Proposed Trial Exhibits", is located under Trial Documents in ECF.
