

United States Magistrate Judge Theresa L. Fricke

Judge Fricke was appointed to the federal bench on May 1, 2017. She is a graduate of the Seattle University School of Law, and the University of Washington Foster School of Business. Before becoming a United States Magistrate Judge, she served as an Assistant Attorney General representing the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) in construction litigation and advising on construction contracts. While an Assistant Attorney General, Judge Fricke was co-chair of the statewide committee on electronic discovery for the Washington State Attorney General's Office.

Judge Fricke is President of The Honorable Robert J. Bryan American Inn of Court in Tacoma. Judge Fricke serves as chairperson of the Social Security Disability bench-bar committee of the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington. She is a member of: The Federal Bar Association for the Western District of Washington; Diversity Committee of the Federal Magistrate Judges Association; and the Magistrate Judge Education Committee of the Ninth Circuit.

Early in her career, Judge Fricke served as a trial and appellate attorney with the Washington State Attorney General (in the Corrections Division, the Human Rights Division, and the DSHS Division). She served as a part-time staff attorney with the Washington Pattern Jury Instruction Committee (2009-12). She worked in private practice in Pierce County (1998-2009); and was a Senior Deputy Prosecuting Attorney with the King County Prosecutor's Office in Seattle, leading the criminal division appellate unit, and handling cases in the Washington Supreme Court (1990-98).

Judge Fricke enjoys trail running, cross-country skiing, horseback riding, bicycling, and traveling with family and friends.
